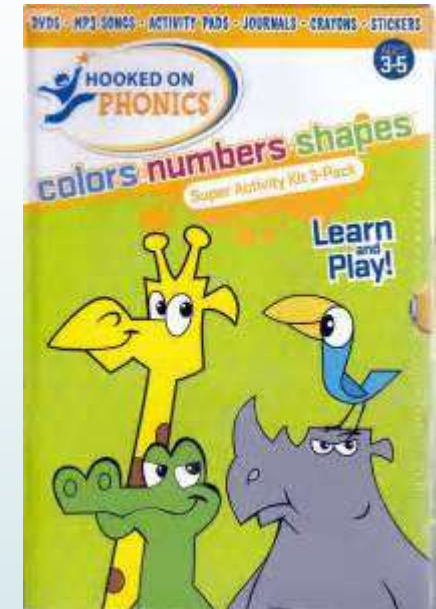
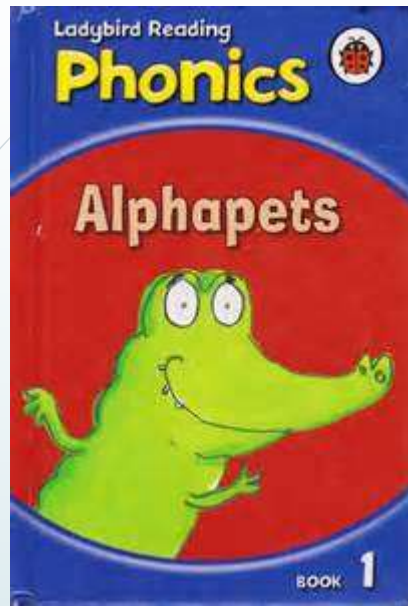

Why Jolly Phonics?





The Jolly Phonics Journey

- Learning to recognise those first 42 sounds
- Learning how to write them from memory
- Learning to blend sounds into words
- Learning to find the sounds they know inside words
- Learning that some words do not blend and you have to remember these words from memory
- Learning that some of the sounds have different ways of writing them down.

How many sounds can you detect?

Assessment of single sounds.

Reader/Writer Detectives

Using a toy safe with the top secret sounds in, one detective reads them to the other whilst the second one notes them down on a white board. Then they swap over roles

D.C.Rule 1

Detectives are not allowed to say a word by itself.

It must be put in a sentence.

So finding a word means it needs a sentence to go with it.

For example

in = I am **in** school

it = **it** is in the playground

Finding words and putting them in sentences = 4th Grade Detective Badge
